My redneck psychotherapist friend Brad Blanton tells me that militarization and open democratic societies do not work together at all and produce pathologies at both the individual and collective levels.

But you have to feel sorry for Private Jackson. It is his ass that gets caught in the disconnect, as he tries to wrap his head around how to be “lethal and compassionate.” As in “Kill the motherfuckers, but be loving and kind to children as you blow their parents’ guts out onto the sidewalk.”

Private Jackson is totally screwed. When he does his soldierly duty of causing misery, death and maiming, he must do it compassionately, according to some hallucination generated in the Pentagon by Secretary of Defense Rumsfeld.

State generated garbage such as “Lethal and compassionate” works fine for these people, whose entire lives have been spent in the controlled environment of America’s industrial military state marketing messages.

All these post-teens in desert camo, the ones making the “good kills”, as an appropriately conducted murder of an Iraqi is deemed military parlance, they are heroes on the TV news. Funny how you cannot see their Clearasil on TV.

I have never seen as much acne medicine as when I was in the military during the Nam era, of which this war reminds me greatly.

As James Carroll brilliantly put it in “A Nation Lost” (*Boston Globe*, 4/22/03):

“Photographic celebrations of our young warriors, glorifications of released American prisoners, heroic rituals of the war dead all take on the character of crass exploitation of the men and women in uniform.

“First they were forced into a dubious circumstance, and now they are themselves being mythologized as its main post-facto justification -- as if the United States went to Iraq not to seize Saddam (disappeared), or to dispose of weapons of mass

destruction (missing), or to save the Iraqi people (chaos), but "to support the troops."

I just heard that Vern and Sherry's kid, Glen, got killed in Iraq.

Vern and Sherry lived in a log cabin near me on the Coeur de Alene Reservation in Idaho a couple decades ago, back when many white people lived on little plots inside the res. Vern had emphysema, Sherry weighed over 300 pounds, and they had a white malamute dog named Ike. The isolation bothered us older people sometimes, and Vern and I drank a lit of whiskey during the six winters I lived there. Hell it was two miles to the mailbox and seven miles to the main road, there was no electricity, and about the only fun available in winter was drinking, guitar picking and horse logging when the ground froze solid enough. But Glen was a little loner and never seemed to mind.

Anyway, Glen, that skinny kid in the fatigues who loved to fish and hunt and damned near set my cabin on fire once while playing with matches, is dead. Killed by a roadside IED. And I cannot help but think about the road that led him to Baghdad. The one that started with the deepest love of his crippled up ole daddy and ended, right along with his chances in life, right after high school when there was no possibility of college and no work within a hundred miles of the reservation.

The kid was quick as a whip, just like his daddy who could draw, do calc in his head and break horses on those days he had enough wind to tackle the job. And like his daddy, Glen was born into one of those corners of America where people are rooted in the earth they were born upon and grow up grounded enough not to care about making it in the big city or imitating what they see on television.

They also grow up proud of their country, untroubled by the bitter truths borne by more educated people.

Their notion of patriotism has to do with a sense of place and people, blood, kin and whatever higher power rustles the branches great red fir trees, animates both the chipmunk and the mountain lion, and stirs fish to leap in the rivers.

But overall, we can expect more of the same. Thousands more dead, blood and treasure hemorrhaged on desert sand for the satisfaction of an elite cult of aging rich men obsessed with power.

FALLUJA ATTACK KILLS SIX US PERSONNEL; 13 WOUNDED, SVBIED HITS MARINE CONVOY

CAMP FALLUJAH, Iraq

A car bomber slammed into a U.S. military convoy in Fallujah June 23, killing five U.S. Marines assigned to II Marine Expeditionary Force and a sailor, CBS News National Security Correspondent David Martin reports. Martin said three women were among those killed. 13 were wounded.

The male Marine was killed by small arms fire immediately afterward, the military said. His family identified him as Cpl. Chad Powell, 22, from northern Louisiana. Powell is survived by his parents, his wife and a 3-year-old son, Elijah.

The Marines were returning to their base, Camp Fallujah, when the ambush took place Thursday night near the eastern entrance to the city, 40 miles west of Baghdad.

The open, seven-ton armored truck was ferrying members of a U.S. military civil affairs team to perform checkpoint searches 40 miles west of Baghdad, according to officials.

It was to be a routine "swap out," or shift change, that included a high number of women because of the need to have females search women travelers at checkpoints.

The majority of the fatalities were Marines assigned to the 2nd Marine Expeditionary Force from Camp LeJeune, N.C., according to 2nd Lt. Barry Edwards. They were assigned to Camp Fallujah.

US troops were calling on Fallujah's residents to remain in their homes, amid high tension.

"Stay inside your homes and if you have any information on terrorists go to the nearest coalition checkpoint and report it," said a voice in Arabic over loudspeakers as US patrols roamed the Sunni Arab city.

U.S. forces in Fallujah arrested Associated Press Television News cameraman Amer Ali who went to the scene at midday Friday, and his video showed black scorch marks along a road and scattered chunks of metal. Video he shot Thursday showed thick plumes of black smoke rising from the blast. [Brilliant. Arrest the reporter. That really will do a lot of good. The resistance is no doubt absolutely terrified at such a devastating riposte. Either that or confirmed once again in their view that their opponents are commanded by nitwits.]

Chad Powell, who joined the Marines in November 2001, is also survived by his wife Danielle and a three-year-old son, Elijah.

Sacramento Guardsman Killed

Arnold Duplantier II had just celebrated his 26th birthday and returned to Iraq when he was killed while guarding the hotel where members of the international media stay, the California National Guard said Friday.

Duplantier was killed by small arms fire Wednesday afternoon while guarding the outside of the Al-Rasheed Hotel in Baghdad, Guard spokesman Tech. Sgt. Andrew Hughan said. He was the only casualty.

He is the 12th California guardsman killed in Iraq and the first from Sacramento.

Baghdad Most Dangerous For U.S. Troops: Wounded Numbers Approach Vietnam Intensity: Endless Tours Of Duty

Although U.S. total deaths in Iraq and the rate at which they are occurring remain vastly below the levels incurred in the Vietnam War from mid-1965 onward, the numbers of seriously injured U.S. troops and the rates at which they are being badly injured, often with life-incapacitating wounds, are growing toward comparable intensity.

Baghdad remains the most dangerous place for U.S. soldiers in the entire country. Some 340 U.S. military fatalities occurred there from May 1, 2003, through June 1 this year, the Iraq Index Project said.

Three-quarters of the U.S. war dead were under age 30, the Iraq Index Project found. From May 1, 2003, through June 4, 2005, 30 percent of those who died were below age 22, another 23 percent between ages 22 and 24 and a quarter between ages 25 and 30. Some 98 percent were male. And 78 percent of them were from the active service personnel from all branches of the military. Some 13 percent of those who died served in the National Guard and 9 percent in the Reserves.

Those who died were overwhelmingly white Americans, the IIP found -- some 73 percent in all. African-Americans comprised 11 percent of the dead and Hispanics another 11 percent. Asian-Americans comprised 2 percent, native American Indian 1 percent and native Hawaiians or Pacific Islanders another 1 percent.

In a finding which has depressing implications for the prospects of establishing security in the near future in Iraq's oil-rich north, some 98 U.S. soldiers were killed during the same time period in the city of Mosul. [The reporter is depressed about the oil production security, not the dead U.S. troops. Well, why not. That's the priority for the Imperial politicians in Washington too. Fuck the dead troops; let's get our hands on the oil.]

Although U.S. total deaths in Iraq and the rate at which they are occurring remain vastly below the levels incurred in the Vietnam War from mid-1965 onward, the numbers of seriously injured U.S. troops and the rates at which they are being badly injured, often with life-incapacitating wounds, are growing toward comparable intensity.

In all, 12,946 U.S. troops have been wounded in action from March 19, 2003 through June 20, 2005.

The drain on U.S. Army personnel being forced to serve often more than one tour in Iraq goes far beyond the force levels of around 140,000 at any given time, according to the IIP.

Between September 2001 and January 2005, almost 600,000 U.S. servicemen have served in land forces in Iraq.

The figures break down as: Active duty -- 307,019; National Guard -- 120,054; Reserve - - 74,104.

Of these forces, 37 percent of the active duty Army personnel have served more than one tour in Iraq; 30 percent of the National Guard forces in Iraq have served there more than once; and 34 percent of the Army Reserve Forces who have served there have done so more than once.

The highest proportion of any combat forces that has served more than once in Iraq is the Air Force Reserve. According to the IIP figures, 49 percent of them have, while 47 percent of the Air Force National Guard troops who served in Iraq have done so more than once.

Body Counts? "As You Know, It Means Nothing"

On June 21, network news reported that the Pentagon had claimed that 47 enemy operatives had been killed in Operation Spear in western Iraq. Last month, the Pentagon declared 125 had been killed in Operation Matador, near the Syrian border. "We don't do body counts on other people," Donald Rumsfeld, the secretary of defence, stated in November 2003.

"They're starting to talk numbers again," Pat Lang remarked to me about the return of body counts. Lang is the former chief at the Defence Intelligence Agency for the Middle East, south Asia and counter-terrorism. "They were determined not to do that. But they can't provide a measurement to tell themselves they're doing well. As you know, it means nothing."

Lang, who served as an intelligence officer in Vietnam, observes: "For almost all of the war, Vietnam was a better situation than Iraq. During the conduct of the war the security situation was far better than this."

About the "euphoria" after the election, especially echoed by the press corps, Lang simply says: "Laughable, comical, pathetic."

Bush's Iraq syndrome is a reinvention of Lyndon Johnson's Vietnam syndrome. In December 1967, Walt Rostow, LBJ's national security adviser, famously declared about the Vietcong and the North Vietnamese: "Their casualties are going up at a rate they cannot sustain ... I see light at the end of the tunnel." The official invitation to the New Year's Eve party at the US embassy in Saigon read: "Come see the light at the end of the tunnel." The Tet offensive struck a month later.

600 More British Reserves Off To Bush's Imperial Slaughterhouse

A further 600 reservists are to be called up to support British military operations in Iraq, the British Government said Friday.

The call-up means that more than 10,000 part-time service personnel will have been deployed in Iraq since the invasion in March 2003, the Ministry of Defence said.

UK forces in Iraq have also had to rely on reserves for communications and intelligence specialists, and engineers. Ingram said deployment would begin this October and most of those called out could expect a ten-month period of mobilization.

The Minister added that not all of those called up would necessarily serve in Iraq and said the move was "routine management" of troops.

However, the opposition Liberal Democrats said this was further evidence of strains in the British armed forces.

Car Bombs: One Hour To Assemble: Cheaper Than A Carton Of Smokes

Car bombers have struck Iraq 479 times in the past year, and a third of the attacks followed the naming of a new Iraqi government two months ago, according to an Associated Press count based on reports from police, military and hospital officials.

The unrelenting attacks use bombs that can cost as little as a carton of American cigarettes each.

As Iraqi and U.S. military officials went over plans for a recent sweep in Baghdad, they made a startling discovery: Rather than assembling car bombs outside the capital, insurgents were fitting the cars with explosives at workshops inside the city itself.

That discovery - from tips by residents - forced officials to scrap the idea of surrounding Baghdad with troops in an effort to control all 23 entrances to the city.

Security forces were stunned to discover that insurgents could rig a car with explosives in one hour or less.

Assorted Resistance Action

Iraqi troops clashed with guerrillas in western Baghdad and at least one soldier was captured.

Gunmen killed police Lt. Col. Majid Faisal Aziz when he was driving his car near western Baghdad's Amiriyah neighborhood, police Capt. Talib Thamer said. Aziz was a member of the Interior Ministry's major crimes division.

A Kurdish contractor working for the American military was killed in northern Kirkuk.

In Baghdad, three police officers were killed in separate incidents, two in the Amiriyah district and another in southern Dora, police and hospital officials said.

Three Iraqis were killed and nine others injured when a booby-trapped tractor exploded near a convoy of Iraqi troops north of Baghdad Friday.

Police said two soldiers were among the dead in the blast that cut through a convoy of 10 military vehicles in the village of Bouzayla.

An attack near an old mall in Baghdad's Karada area killed seven civilians and wounded 10 others, the defense ministry said, while the Iraqi police put the death toll at 12 civilians and three police officers, with 50 wounded.

Three police officers and seven civilians died in a second blast targeting an Iraqi police patrol near a gas station, the ministry said.

Unknown armed assailants sent mortar shells into Mosul's police academy, police sources said today. While the academy's building sustained some damage, no one inside was hurt.

Three policemen were also wounded Friday in a roadside bombing that targeted their convoy in the disputed northern oil city of Kirkuk.

In the predominantly Sunni northern city of Mosul, four Iraqis including a police officer were killed and five others wounded in three separate attacks late Thursday and early Friday, police Brigadier General Wathiq Mohammed said.

He makes it seem like he is doing the best he can for you, when his primary intentions are filling his re-enlistment quota, filling army school quotas, filling his pocket with bonus pay and adding to his own prestige by putting notches on his re-up stick.

He comes on like a friend - a guy really interested in your life. But how can anybody profess to be looking out for your best interests when his job depends on getting so many guys each month to take the six year hitch.

Many methods are used to get a guy to take that first step which leads to getting hooked. I say hooked because if you think it rough looking for a job on the outside when you're 21, watch how hard it is when you're just getting out at the age of 27. That's why the Army only offers that big cash bonus on the first 6-year enlistment and never again. After taking 6, you're as good as being hooked.

These high pressure salesmen have all your records at their disposal. They know everything about you before they see you and figure which approach to use to either coax, pressure, trick or brow-beat you into re-enlisting.

If after checking your records he sees that your parents are dead, he'll tell you that you have nothing to go back to; if your scores equal a fifth grade education, he'll tell you how lucky you were to qualify for some crazy school. And if you show a working class background, he'll bring up the big cash bonus. Whatever your story is, he's got a sales pitch especially suited for you.

Everyone has to get at least one re-up talk during their tour. The Army makes sure everyone gets the "have a seat - would you care for a cigarette?" -- sales talk because they are working on the law of averages. Out of any 100 men who go through the pressure box, a certain number will give in every time and sign the dotted line. As the Army boasts, the re-enlistment team consists of all officers and NCO's along with the official buzzard, the career counselor.

Arrest Warrants Issue For CIA Team Over Milan Kidnapping

An Italian judge has issued arrest warrants for 13 CIA agents who allegedly kidnapped an Egyptian terrorist suspect in Milan two years ago and flew him to Cairo where he was questioned and tortured, it emerged yesterday.

The agents are said to have seized imam Hassan Mustafa Osama Nasr, also known as Abu Omar, while he was walking from his home to a mosque in the Italian city. They allegedly bundled the 42-year-old into a van before driving him to the Italian-US air base at Aviano, northern Italy.

The following day he was flown to another US air base at Ramstein, Germany, and then taken by private jet to Egypt.

According to Italian investigators the alleged abduction, believed to have been part of the CIA's "extraordinary rendition programme" in which terrorist suspects were transferred to third countries without court approval, violated Italian sovereignty.

The investigators also claim to have traced the CIA agents through hotel bills that they ran up at Milan's best five-star hotels while allegedly preparing the kidnap plan.

US officials have yet to respond to the arrest warrants but the case is likely to embarrass the CIA, not least because many details about the kidnap plan have been leaked to Italian newspapers.

According to reports the abduction would have been costly since the agents stayed in hotels such as the Hilton and the Principe di Savoia in Milan, running up bills of €120,000 (£80,000) for food and accommodation alone.

After the imam was back in Egypt, senior agents celebrated the success of the job at a five-star hotel in Venice and other agents were sent on holiday to other parts of Italy.

BUSH PROPOSES CHARGING AXIS OF EVIL NATIONS ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP DUES

'The Free Ride is Over,' Says President

Looking for new ways to slash the mounting federal budget deficit, President George W. Bush today proposed charging Iran and North Korea annual dues for their membership in the Axis of Evil.

The president's plan, which took many in Congress and in the diplomatic community by surprise, would put responsibility for the rising costs of military spending, Social Security and other government programs squarely on the shoulders of America's two most despised enemies.

President Bush made the proposal in a speech in Flint, Michigan, telling his audience that for Iran and North Korea, both members of the Axis of Evil since 2001, "the free ride is over."

"Iran and North Korea have enjoyed all the benefits of Axis of Evil membership without paying a dime for them," said Mr. Bush. "Well, if they think that state of affairs can continue forever, they are sorely mistaken."

While Mr. Bush stopped short of naming an exact figure for annual membership in the Axis of Evil, he warned the two nations, "Membership in the most exclusive evil club in the world does not come cheap."

President Bush reserved some of his remarks for Iraq, telling the audience that while there had been some setbacks in the conflict there, "The war is still going better than the Russian space program."

Elsewhere, Sen. Joseph Biden (D-Del) said that his presidential ambitions would not be hurt by an incident in 1988 in which he was accused of plagiarizing a political speech, telling reporters, "That happened four score and seven years ago."
