It started as a modest sized march.

Two squads of 25 IVAW members each formed up outside the venue and began marching to the Pepsi center.

From the Rage Against the Machine concert at the Denver Coliseum, about 150 soldiers in uniform began the four-mile march to the Pepsi Center in downtown Denver to protest the Iraq War.

The squads were led by members in dress uniforms and combat uniforms, with thousands of supporters marching behind them in support.

The group of mostly young people walked behind a banner that said: "Support GI Resistance."

Though the event, co-sponsored by the anti-war group Tent State University and Iraq Veterans Against the War, was unpermitted, the parade proceeded peacefully.

Behind the troops, who marched calling cadence and chanting antiwar slogans, came a larger group in civilian clothes, cheering and waving signs, and growing larger and larger as the marchers wended their way through the downtown.

Wearing T-shirts and stickers with slogans such as "Arrest Bush" and "Make Out Not War," they sang rolling chants, Marine- style. "Tell Me What We're Marching For," sang one group. "Stop the torture, stop the war," answered another.

People lined the streets to watch, most approvingly.

As the marchers wound their way through the neighborhoods west of the coliseum, they found solidarity with a group of Latinos holding up an anti-war sign and cheering them on.

"Si, se puede!" shouted some young marchers. "Yes, we can!"

Not everyone was as respectful.

From the balcony of an apartment complex, a man yelled at the throngs of protesters to move on. "Don't come back here," he said.

But one protester had the last word: He suggested the man join the Army.

As they drew near the heavily guarded convention center, cops in riot gear lined the street, and helicopters buzzed overhead. At an intersection, the group stopped facing squad cars with lights on and a phalanx of black-clad police.

"We can go on here or not," one of the march's organizers told the troops through a megaphone. The march was unauthorized and it was unclear whether the police intended to have a confrontation.

She seemed to be trying to calm everyone for a moment, pointing out that the Denver police so far have not been "prone to violence."

The march continued, and the civilians bringing up the rear cheered.

It was quite a spectacle: the soldiers in dress uniform and fatigues, and the cops in riot gear watching them from the sidelines.

The soldiers chanted:

"Everywhere we go People want to know Who we are Where we came from. We are the veterans Iraq War veterans Antiwar veterans Pissed-off veterans"

At an intersection, the group stopped to read a letter to Barack Obama asking that he agree to three core principles: the immediate withdrawal of troops from Iraq, full and adequate health care for all returning U.S. service members, and reparations to the Iraqi people.

The letter also upbraided the Democratic Party for their "initial and continued" support for the war.

The police presence intensified. I passed a cop videotaping the marchers and a marcher in a green "copwatch" vest videotaping him right back.

Over the long course, from the outskirts of town into the denser downtown, the energy from the crowd seemed to build. The marchers chanting had a hypnotic effect.

"It's alright
Its OK
Remember MLK
He tried to lead the way
But he was shot one day
early in the morning"

Thus far, the march has been peaceful and well received, as residents along the route sprayed the marchers with hoses and provided water from their homes and businesses.

More and more people joined the march, until, suddenly, looking back as the group crossed a bridge and then paused right outside the Pepsi Center, you could see several thousand people in a line stretching as far as the eye could see.

As the group passed into the perimeter of the convention hall, the police presence grew more threatening. "Hey, those ones have masks," someone pointed out. A group of police in gas masks were pulling on thick gloves and grabbing their batons.

A white van with police in black flak jackets hanging off it rolled alongside the marchers.

The feeling of the whole, thousands-strong group was moving. "It's beautiful," one marcher said, looking back at the crowd in the late afternoon sun.

Joey Minicucci, 18, of Littleton, noted that his brother was in the military and would soon be sent to Iraq. That was one of the reasons he was going to the march.

Anne Hill, of Montrose, had other reasons. "I'm marching because it seems to be the last vestiges of our free speech and because people have demands and our government's not listening," she said.

The march came to a standstill at the perimeter of the Pepsi Center around 6:30 p.m., at which time the veterans attempted to have their statement delivered to Obama.

Tension with police seemed to escalate, until several veterans stepped forward and saluted police. "We are your brothers and sisters in arms," said one.

"We don't want to hurt you. We don't want you to hurt us."

With that, the standoff melted away and soon an appropriate aide was contacted.

"I figured as long as we kept things peaceful, they would hear us, and they did," said Army veteran Jeffrey Wood.

Nancy Pelosi, meanwhile, was answering tough questions from the founder of Digg on CNN about why the Democrats in Congress have failed to pull the troops out of Iraq.

Baghdad IED Kills Two U.S. Soldiers

BAGHDAD – Two 13th Sustainment Command (Expeditionary) Soldiers died of wounds suffered following an improvised explosive device in eastern Baghdad Aug. 28 at approximately 2:30 a.m.

Saturday at about 8 a.m. a truck bomber attacked a small police station in the remote village of Hamad north of Baghdad, killing six police, said officials from the Iraqi army and police.

13 policemen were injured in the morning attack.

Police attempted to stop the truck, opening fire and forcing the attacker to change direction and slam into a concrete barrier near a market, they said. The blast damaged the police station and a number of nearby homes and shops, the officials said. Fifteen people were also wounded in the attack, said the police official.

Hamad lies on the edge of Shirqat, a town between Tikrit and Mosul.

The attack comes three days after Iraqi police defused a car bomb in the same area, said Shirqat's police chief, Ali al-Jubouri.

A roadside bomb targeting an Iraqi army patrol wounded a soldier in northern Mosul, 390 km (240 miles) north of Baghdad on Thursday, police said.

A roadside bomb killed a policeman and wounded another when it struck a police patrol in northern Mosul, 390 km (240 miles) north of Baghdad, police said.

Insurgents in a speeding car attacked a police foot patrol in central Kirkuk, 250 km (155 miles) north of Baghdad, killing a policeman and wounding another, late on Wednesday, police said.

A car bomb patrol wounded two policemen, in eastern Baghdad, police said.

Insurgents shot dead a policeman at a checkpoint in Abu Ghraib late on Monday, police said.

A bomb attached to a car wounded a municipal official, along with three of his bodyguards, in Baghdad's central Karrada district, police said.

A roadside bomb killed one policeman and wounded another when it struck a police patrol in central Samarra, 100 km (62 miles) north of Baghdad, police said.

A roadside bomb wounded four policemen in central Baghdad, police said.

Two police officials say a parked car bomb exploded Thursday near a U.S. military base north of Baghdad, killing one and wounding six people.

Three car bombs exploded in northern Baghdad, wounding four police officers. Another car bomb also struck a police patrol in eastern Baghdad.

PESHAWAR, Pakistan — A bomber attacked the main border crossing for convoys ferrying supplies to U.S. and NATO troops in Afghanistan on Thursday, killing at 22 security officers and wounding 15 others.

The strike will raise fears the Pakistani Taliban is regrouping and making good on its word to carry out revenge attacks following the slaying of its leader, Baitullah Mehsud, in a CIA missile strike earlier this month.

The attacker got into barracks at the Torkham checkpoint in the Khyber region and detonated his explosives, local police officer Sadiq Khan said. The victims were breaking their daylong fast during the Islamic holy month of Ramadan. The border had closed for the day a few hours earlier.

Ali Raza, an official in the administration office, said he heard a huge explosion in the building next door.

"We rushed out and saw destruction all around," Raza said.

The Torkham checkpoint marks the main border crossing from Pakistan's Khyber Pass into Afghanistan.

U.S. troops in landlocked Afghanistan rely on the supply line for food and fuel.

"We claim responsibility for the blast," Azam Tariq, spokesman for Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), said in a telephone call from an unknown location.

He said "the victims of the attack were all those supporting the United States. Anybody supporting the US is our enemy."

Three U.S. Troops Wounded In Shahjoy Convoy Attack

A bomber attacked a convoy of US troops in Zabul province earlier today.

The bomber detonated the explosives strapped in his body when a convoy of US military was passing by a crowded bazaar in the remote district of Shahjoy, said Zabul Police Chief Gen Abdul Rahman Sarjang.

At least 23 Afghan civilians and three US soldiers were injured in the huge blast occurred in volatile southern Afghan province today morning, the police official further said.

A purported Taliban spokesman, Qari Yousuf Ahmadi, speaking from an undisclosed location claimed responsibility for the attack.

The bomber named Mirwais, rammed his motorbike into a convoy of foreign troops and blew up the explosives rigged in the motorcycle, the Taliban spokesman told Quqnoos.

Surviving US soldiers have cordoned off the blast scene in the bazaar.

The bomber attacked a vehicle of district intelligence head but he survived the attempt on his life.

Taliban insurgents ambushed a convoy of Afghan counter-narcotics police, killing three and wounding 23 others on the outskirts of Ghazni city southwest of Kabul, provincial police chief Khial Baz Sherzai said.

Four Afghan police officers were killed when their military vehicle struck a roadside bomb in the eastern Ali Sher district of Khost province on Thursday, said Sher Ahmad, a district police officer.

Three rockets landed in Kabul late on Friday, said Abdul Ghafar Sayed Zada, chief of the criminal investigations department of the city police. He said he was not aware of any casualties. Reuters correspondents heard the blasts.

A roadside bomb killed one Afghan policeman and wounded eleven others, including six civilians, on the outskirts of Kandahar city on Friday, senior police officer Mohammad Shah Khan said.

Three insurgents and one local guard were killed when Taliban fighters ambushed NATO's supply trucks in the Qara Bagh district of Ghazni, southwest of Kabul, a local police officer said.

Insurgents killed one local employee of a explosives clearing agency and wounded four others in an attack on the outskirts of the provincial capital, Lashkar Gah, supervisor Farhad Noori said. Six others workers are missing.

POLITICIANS CAN'T BE COUNTED ON TO HALT THE BLOODSHED

THE TROOPS HAVE THE POWER TO STOP THE WARS

Australia's Highest Court Ruled Wednesday That The Country's

Military Justice System Is Unconstitutional; "Judges Are Not Independent Of The Military Command"

[Comment, Mike Woloshin, Vietnam Veterans Against The War: "Shouldn't American 'Military Justice' be conducted by an independent authority, in which judges, prosecutors and defense attorneys are not selected by the 'convening authority' and in which the possibility of 'command influence' does not exist to taint the outcome of a trial!]

Australia's highest court ruled Wednesday that the country's military justice system is unconstitutional because its judges are not independent of the military command -- throwing into doubt 171 cases judged in the past two years.

The previous government created the Australian Military Court in October 2007 as a modern means of enforcing military discipline, replacing the systems of courts-martial and military magistrates.

But the High Court upheld a challenge by former sailor Brian Lane that the military court was unconstitutional, saying the judges were not independent of the military chain of command.

Lane has been charged with assault of a superior officer. The charge has not been resolved.

Defense Minister John Faulkner said 171 military discipline cases had been dealt with by the court since 2007, some ending in jail sentences.

"As a result of the decision of the High Court of Australia today, the validity of the decisions made by the AMC during its existence will be reviewed," Faulkner told reporters.

He said the government might be able to pass legislation "to ensure that the effect of the sentences passed is validated."

The government also plans to rush legislation through Parliament to restore the old military justice system of trials by court martial and military magistrates.

"In the interim, it is critical that the Australian Defense Force has a functioning military discipline system, particularly when it is currently engaged in operations overseas," Faulkner said, referring to deployments including 1,500 troops in Afghanistan.

He said the government will have to examine the High Court ruling and seek legal advice before deciding on a new court model for the future that will comply with the constitution.

The military court deals with disciplinary charges -- such as disobeying orders and going absent without leave -- as well as other charges covered by civil law such as theft and assault.



Between 15 and 30 thousand predominantly Chicanos (Americans of Mexican descent) gathered in East LA's Laguna Park as the culmination of the Chicano National Moratorium.

It was organized to protest the disproportionate number of deaths of Chicano soldiers in Vietnam (more than double their numbers in the population). There had been more than 20 other such demonstrations across the southwest.

Three died when the anti-war march turned violent.

The Los Angeles Police Department attacked and one gunshot, fired into Silver Dollar Bar, killed Ruben Salazar, a Los Angeles Times columnist and a commentator on KMEX-TV (he had been accused by the LAPD of inciting the Chicano community).

Israel: "It's The Ugly Face Of Fascism That Emerges"

MY FIRST thought was: Good God, this man was responsible for the lives of our soldiers!

The second thought was: What's the big surprise? You always knew what kind of person he was! After all, during his years as the army's Chief of Staff he quietly supported the setting up of "illegal" settlement outposts all over the West Bank!

The third thought: And this person is now Vice Prime Minister and a member of the "Sextet" – the six ministers who constitute the real government of Israel.

THE OCCASION for these frightening thoughts was the participation of Moshe ("Bogie") Ya'alon in a gathering of the Jewish Leadership Faction.

"Peace Now is a virus," he said there. And not only they.

"All the media" are also a virus. They influence the public discourse "in a distorted manner, a lying manner".

The virus also includes "the elite" in general.

In addition, the "politicians" are to blame. "Every time the politicians bring in the dove of peace, we, the army, have to clean up after it."

His summing up: "The Jews have a right to settle in any place throughout Eretz Israel."

And if this upsets the Americans, Ya'alon has a ready answer: "I am not afraid of the Americans!"

All this was said a few days after Ya'alon paid a well publicized visit to the occupied territories, accompanied by Shas leader Eli Yishai and several other ministers of the extreme Right. This band visited the settlement outposts, which the Israeli government long ago promised the Americans to dismantle, and expressed total opposition to their evacuation.

They concluded their visit in Homesh, the West Bank settlement evacuated by Ariel Sharon in the course of the "disengagement". Ya'alon demanded the resettlement of the place.

THESE TONES come together in a frightening melody, a tune we know all too well.

It is anthem of fascism.

First: the term "elite". In the jargon of the Israeli extreme Right, this includes everybody they hate: the intellectuals, the universities, the liberal politicians, the Supreme Court, the media.

The term is rooted in the Latin verb "eligere", to pick out, meaning the best, the select.

Since this is an undefined body, the term can be applied to different targets.

When the demagogues address the Oriental Jewish masses, "the elite" clearly consists of the Ashkenazis who rule the country.

When addressing the religious community, "the elite" consist of the secular, the atheist, who are strangers to Jewish Tradition.

When addressing the Russian immigrants, "the elite" consists of the old established Israelis, the native born, who obstruct the path of the new immigrants.

When one bundles all these together, there emerges a picture of "them" and "us". "Them" – the handful of arrogant old-timers, who occupy all the key positions in the state, and "us" – the simple, honest people, the patriots, the keepers of tradition, the discriminated against, the oppressed.

Every fascist group in the world entertains such a view of "the elite".

(Never mind that Ya'alon, like most of the other demagogues, himself belongs to the elite. He was born in the country, an Ashkenazi of Ukrainian descent. His original name was Smilansky. He is still officially a member of an "elitist" kibbutz and belongs to the super-privileged senior officers' corps.)

Second: The traitors.

There is an enemy within. This is no less dangerous than the foreign enemy, indeed, much more dangerous.

When Ya'alon speaks about Peace Now, he means all the peace camp, the liberal and secular section of society.

That is the Fifth Column, the Trojan horse within the walls. They have to be eliminated, before one can turn to fight the foreign foe.

Third: The "politicians".

The demagogues are, of course, themselves politicians, but they exclude themselves here. Ya'alon paints a picture of "the politicians" who bring in a disgusting peace dove, whose excrement the army has to clean up.

The knavish, scheming, cowardly politicians on the one side, the clean-cut, heroic, loyal army on the other – that is a very familiar picture.

The best known example was current in Germany after World War I.

The "knife in the back" legend was a stepping stone to power for Adolf Hitler: the German army stood up to the enemy and had victory in its sights, when "the politicians", the Jews, the socialists and the other "November criminals" stuck a knife in the back of the heroic fighters.

The peace dove leaves its droppings and the soldiers are compelled to clean up the filth of peace.

And also: "All the media".

That is one of the marks of fascism in Israel and throughout the world.

The media are always "leftist", "anti-national", they are the "hostile media".

The journalists and broadcasters are a secret league of Israel-bashers, who spread lies and distort reality in order to undermine national morale, defame the army, besmirch our national values and give comfort to the enemy.

Reality is, of course, very, very different.

The Israeli media slavishly repeat the official propaganda in all national and security matters. They are conformist to a high degree and mobilized from wall to wall.

There is not a single leftist newspaper in the country.

Most political correspondents repeat like parrots the statements of "official sources"; almost all the correspondents for Arab affairs are former army intelligence officers; and almost all military correspondents serve as unofficial army spokesmen. In the news pages and news programs, right-wing terminology reigns supreme.

But because in less important matters the media criticize the government, as they are duty-bound to do in a democratic society, it is easy to portray them as "leftist" and subversive. The same is true for academia.

And finally: The "virus".

The description of political opponents as infectious agents or disgusting vermin is one of the most distinguishing features of the extreme Right.

It is sufficient to remember Dr. Joseph Goebbels' film "The Eternal Jew", in which the Jews were shown as rats spreading disease.

If one puts all these features together - the hatred of "the elite", the glorification of the army, the contempt for "the politicians", the demonization of the peace camp, the incitement against the media – it's the ugly face of fascism that emerges.

Here in Israel and all over the world.

NO LESS important are the location and the company.

Ya'alon spoke at a gathering of the "Jewish Leadership Faction". This is a group of ultraultra rightists, who entered the Likud with the declared objective of conquering it from within. It is headed by one Moshe Feiglin, hence its followers are usually called "the Feiglins".

On the eve of the last elections, Binyamin Netanyahu made an all-out effort, using kosher and not-so-kosher means, to remove Feiglin from the Likud's list of candidates. He was determined to avoid the Likud being presented as an extreme-Right party. The Likud's main competitor, Kadima, defined itself as a center or moderate-rightist party and tried very hard to push Netanyahu to the right.

Netanyahu thought that by driving the Feiglins out he could blunt this attack.

The question is whether this was his only aim. If so, why did he raise Benny Begin, a person who personifies the far-right, into a conspicuous place on the list? And why did he enlist and embrace Moshe Ya'alon, who was already known as a person of extreme rightist views? That embrace was very costly, since in the end Kadima, against all expectations, won one seat more than the Likud.

But Netanyahu, a born politician, had more than one objective in mind. He was afraid that Feiglin would one day threaten his hold on the Likud leadership. To forestall this possibility, he denied Feiglin a seat in the Knesset.

And here comes Ya'alon, Netanyahu's pampered protégé, and joins Feiglin of all people.

As the Hebrew saying goes, the swallow went to visit the crow. But it is not quite clear who is the swallow and who the crow. Is Feiglin using Ya'alon – or is Ya'alon intending to use Feiglin in order to position himself as the leader of a big extreme-Right camp?

ONE SHOULD also pay attention to Ya'alon's declaration that "I am not afraid of the Americans".

The Americans demand the freezing of the settlements? To hell with them! Who do they think they are? What, these Goyim are ordering us around? Barack Obama wants to tell us where we can settle and where we can't?

That is another feature of the emerging Israeli fascism: the readiness to engage in an open confrontation with the United States, and especially with President Obama.

Already an Israeli campaign against "Barack Saddam Hussein", the New Hitler, is in full swing. The American Right and the Israeli Right easily find a common language. An Israeli woman in the US is heading the well publicized effort to prove that Obama was not born in the US, that his father never was a US citizen, and that he should therefore be driven out of the White House.

The whole thing borders on madness. Israel is dependent on the US for practically everything: economic assistance, arms, intelligence cooperation, diplomatic support like the veto in the Security Council. Netanyahu is trying to avoid a confrontation by using every trick of deceit and diversion.

And here come Ya'alon & Co. and call for an open revolt against the USA!

There is method in this madness. The Israeli education system glorifies the Zealots, who some 1940 years ago declared war on the Roman Empire. The Zealots became the leaders of the Jewish community in Palestine and launched a revolt that had no chance at all of succeeding. The rebels were defeated, Jerusalem was destroyed, the Temple was burned to the ground.

THE BOGIE HORROR SHOW has wider ramifications.

It presents a picture of a mad group of extremists challenging the moderate, responsible Netanyahu. Netanyahu signals to Obama and his people: Help! If you pressure me on

the freezing of the settlements and the dismantling of the outposts, it will be the end of me! My government will fall, and you will have to deal with the crazies!

That would be more convincing, if Netanyahu had used his legal prerogative and dismissed Ya'alon from the government, even though that represents a political risk.

Instead, "Bibi" summoned "Bogie", like a headmaster who summons a boy and orders him to write a hundred times "I shall be a good boy". So Ya'alon remains Vice Prime Minister, Minister in Charge of Strategic Affairs and a member of the governing Sextet of Ministers (the others being Avigdor Lieberman, Benny Begin, Eli Yishai, Dan Meridor and Binyamin Netanyahu himself.)

This being so, Netanyahu cannot evade responsibility for everything Ya'alon does and says.

What do you actually want? Do you really want to outdo those who trod you down a generation ago into your own blood and into your own excrement Do you want to pass on the old torture to others now in all its bloody and dirty detail with all the brutal delight of torturers as suffered by your fathers? Do you really want to be the new Gestapo the new Wehrmacht the new SA and SS and turn the Palestinians into the new Jews? Well then I too want, having fifty years ago myself been tormented for being a Jewboy by your tormentors, to be a new Jew with these new Jews you are making of the Palestinians And I want to help lead them as a free people into their own land of Palestine from whence you have driven them or in which you plague them vou apprentices of the Swastika you fools and changelings of history whose Star of David on your flags turns ever quicker into that damned symbol with its four feet that you just do not want to see but whose path you are following today




